Degree Breakdown:

<u>University Core: (Typically 35 hours)</u>: Often referred to as 'general education' courses, these options are listed on the first page of this work sheet

<u>Major Requirements: (Hours Vary)</u>: These are the courses specifically required by the department to complete a degree and are listed above.

<u>General Electives: (Varies by major)</u>: These courses make up the difference to reach 120 total hours beyond University Core and Major Requirements. These courses must be 1000 level or higher (in some cases, 3000 level or higher), courses not already required, and courses you do not have previous credit for. These courses are great to use for other majors and minors.

Fulbright Writing Requirement: Each Fulbright graduate must complete a writing requirement to graduate.

GPA: Every student must have at least a 2.00 cumulative grade point average to be eligible to graduate from the University of Arkansas.

Graduation Hour Rules

24-, 30-, and 40-Hour Rules: Also known as residency requirements, these hours can come from major/minors. In some cases, courses may overlap in each of the hour rules below.

- 24-Hour Rule: Students must complete at least24 hours of 3000+ level classes in Fulbright College.
- 30-Hour Rule: Students must complete at least30 hours of 3000+ level classes at the University of Arkansas. This can include courses taken for the 24-hour rule.
- 40-Hour Rule: Students must complete at least40 hours of 3000+ level classes in total, including transfer courses. Courses that are 2000 level and have a pre-requisite may also count for this rule. This can include courses taken for the 24-hour and 30-hour rules.

COURSES THAT DO NOT COUNT FOR GRADUATION

The following courses do not count toward degree credit in any college or school at the University of Arkansas:

- ENGL 0002, ENGL 00001, MATH 0001, MATH 0002L, MATH 0003, MATH 0131, MATH 00101, MATH 00202, and MATH 01101
- Duplicated/Repeated courses (i.e.: if the same course is taken more than once, the hours will only count once for graduation)
