All requirements in Stage I must be met to be cleared for the residency. Please contact the Director of Field Placement and Licensure, Peabody Hall Room 109, College of Education and Health Professions for more information.

Stage II: One Year Supervised Residency

- Enroll in Residency I and Residency II in consecutive semesters (Fall-Spring or Spring-Fall).
- 2. Complete Residency I at approved elementary or secondary placement before enrolling in Residency II.
- 3. Complete Residency II at approved elementary or secondary placement.
- 4. Complete the PRAXIS Music Content Knowledge Exam (5113, 5115, or 5116) if planning to apply for Arkansas Licensure (recommended, but not required for degree completion). See your adviser for completion dates.

Students should always consult the Licensure Officer, Peabody Hall Room 109, for any licensure requirement changes. Students will not be licensed to teach in Arkansas until they have met all requirements for licensure as set forth by the Division of Elementary & Secondary Education — Arkansas Department of Education.

Licensure or certification in another state is facilitated by first receiving a license in Arkansas. An application must be made directly to that state's department of education by the student. In many instances the applications are referred to the Licensure Officer, Peabody Hall Room 109.

Honors

Minimum Requirements for Honors:

- Maintain cumulative grade point average of 3.5.
- Complete Honors Capstone Project
- Complete all required Honors Courses
