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The certificate is designed for working professionals who wish to develop basic skills in the emerging field of geospatial technologies. Instruction prepares these individuals for employment in the geosciences and collateral disciplines as well as providing a foundational skill set for additional advanced work if desired. The certificate will also benefit students in two-year associate degree programs as well as undergraduates in four-year programs who wish to strengthen their skills.

Requirements for admission: Candidates should possess an associate's degree, two years of college, or equivalent work experience.
