Recognizes an exceptional junior pre-medical chemistry major. This award is made possible through memorial gifts for Dr. Jacob Sacks, a long-time member of the

faculty. Sacks and his wife, Wilma, were both medical doctors and established the first biochemistry research laboratory in the department - **Rachel Thomas**

#### Gold Medals Awarded

The department, faculty and students were honored during the State and National Awards ceremony and reception April 28 sponsored by the office of post graduate fellowships.

The department received the 2008 Departmental Gold Medal for support of honors students and their research.

Durham's years of service to date make him one of only 11 department chairmen to serve more than five years — **Dan Davis** 1991-1998, **Les Howick** 1972-1979, **Walt Meyer** 1967-1972, **Sam Siegel** 1957-1963, **Edgar Wertheim** 1946-1951, **Charles Carroll** 1905-1916, **Albert Menke** 1887-1902 and **F. L. Harvey** 1875-1880. **Harrison Hale** served the longest term with 27 years from 1918-1945.
