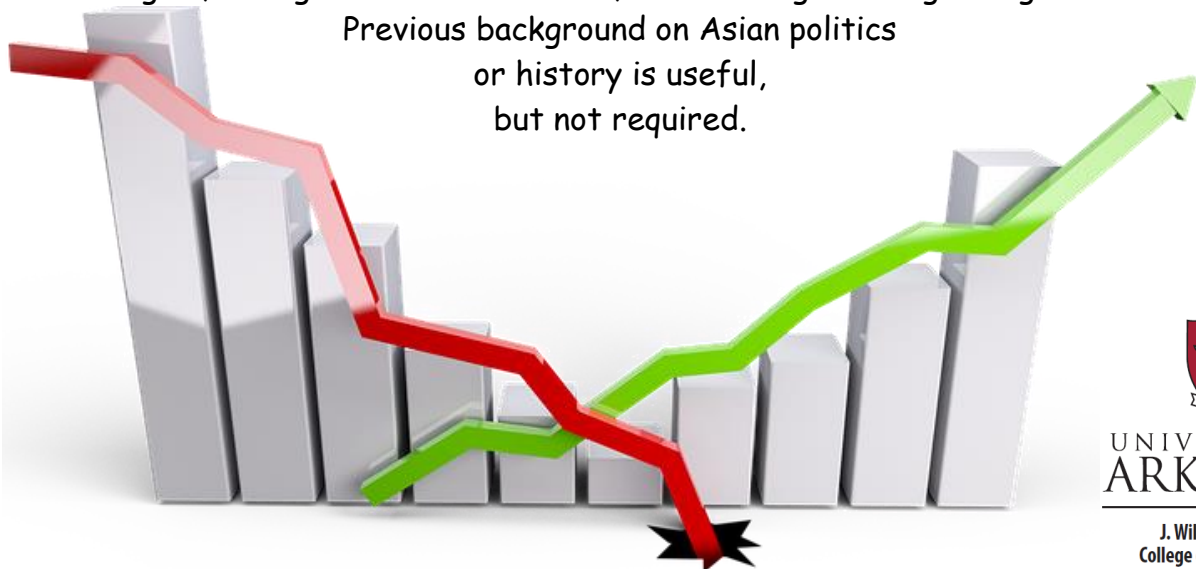
Chinese Foreign Policy
