Methodology and Sample Information

Between October 9th and October 21st, 2020, Issues & Answers Network, Inc. completed 804 telephone interviews among a random sample of adult Arkansans. Forty percent of all respondents interviewed use their cell phones for all or most of their calls.

Unless otherwise noted, the margin of error is +/- 3.4 percentage points, meaning we are 95 percent confident that the actual result lies within 3.4 percentage points (in either direction) of the result our sample produced. The findings in parentheses are for self-identified “very likely voters” only (N=591); the margin of error is +/- 3.9 percentage points.

Employing guidelines established by the [American Association for Public Opinion Research](#), the poll’s overall cooperation rate was 46%. This figure reflects completed surveys as a percentage of all eligible individuals contacted.⁸ As in past years, the sample was provided by MSG (Marketing Systems Group).

To assess the representativeness of the sample drawn for the poll, the Arkansas Poll team publishes what most polling organizations do not: a comparison of survey respondents’ key demographic characteristics to those of the state as a whole. This information is reported in the table below.
