# Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The HRSA Scholarship Program is designed to develop and expand the behavioral health workforce serving populations across the lifespan, including in rural and medically underserved areas. The HRSA Scholarship will provide financial stipends for *up to* 28 advanced level MSW students each year (2017-2021) who are placed in field internships that practice integrated, behavioral healthcare services to traditionally underserved, diverse clients and in rural and/or medically underserved areas.

HRSA scholarships provide stipends totaling \$10,000 (\$5,000 per semester) to offset graduate school tuition, fees, transportation and housing. Stipends will not interfere with student loans or other academic scholarships. If you have a Graduate Assistantship (within the School of Social Work or any University of Arkansas department) and/or another stipend in excess of \$5,000, you are ineligible to receive the HRSA scholarship.

Given the limited number of HRSA scholarships, we are unable to allocate stipends and educational training and materials to all advanced level MSW students. The HRSA Research Team in the School of Social Work will review student applications and allocate stipends for students and internships that best meet the intent of the HRSA Scholarship Program.

To be eligible for the HRSA Scholarship, students are required to engage in the following activities:

- 1. Attend HRSA Fellowship Orientation with HRSA Faculty Team in August
- 2. Participate in 3 Integrated Behavioral Health Skills Labs during the academic year. 1-2 of the Skills Labs will take place outside of regular class hours.
- 3. Complete pre- and post- Skills Lab surveys. The surveys are designed to measure integrated behavioral health knowledge and skill sets prior to and following the Skills Labs.
- 4. Submit capstone research project to present a poster session at their state's National Association of Social Workers annual conference.
- 5. Submit (a) proof from the state's NASW that HRSA Fellows submitted their capstone for presentation, and (b) receipt of registration to the annual NASW conference in your state. Please submit these documents in pdf format via email to Dr. Shobe (<u>mshobe@uark.edu</u>) by **January 1**<sup>st</sup> to receive \$500 in travel funds (to offset registration, food, transportation, and lodging) to attend your state's NASW conference.
