Major Requirements for History:

- ❖ 36 semester hours to include:
 - HIST 1003 Institutions and Ideas of Western Civilization **AND** HIST 1013 Institutions and Ideas of Western Civilization II
or
 - HIST 1113 Institutions and Ideas of World Civilizations **AND** HIST 1123 Institutions and Ideas of World Civilizations II
or
 - HIST 1113H Honors World Civilization **AND** HIST 1123H Honors World Civilization II

and

- HIST 2003 History of the American People to 1877 **AND** HIST 2013 History of the American People, 1877 to present
- HIST 4893 Senior Capstone Seminar

- **21 hours in history courses number 3000 or above**

- at least 12 hours of which must be above the 4000 level
- students must select 3 hours from each of the following areas:

Requirements for Departmental Honors in History:

Admission to the Departmental Honors Program in History is open to history majors with a minimum grade-point average of 3.5 in all their work. Prospective Departmental Honors students must take 12 hours in Honors Studies, of which 6 hours must include HIST 3973H Honors Methods (Spring semester, junior year and HIST 399VH, Honors History Thesis, Fall or Spring semester, senior year). During the senior year, the honors candidate will complete the program by writing an honors thesis. Successful completion of the program will be recognized by the award of the distinction "History Scholar Cum Laude" at graduation. Higher degree distinctions are recommended only in truly exceptional cases and are based upon the whole of the candidate's program of honors studies.

40-Hour Rule

Students must complete at least 40 hours of work in courses number 3000 and above. Included in this 40 hours can be courses numbered 2000 if each has a specific course designated as a prerequisite, with the exception of MILS 2001 and 2011, AERO 2001 and 2011, and foreign language courses numbered 2003 and 2013.

24-Hour Rule

A student graduating from Fulbright College must complete at least 24 hour of work in courses numbered 3000 and above from departments within the Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences.
